- Article 32 of the Civil Act
- Rules for the Supervision of Non-profit Corporations under the Jurisdiction of the Ministry of Culture and Sports and the Cultural Heritage Administration

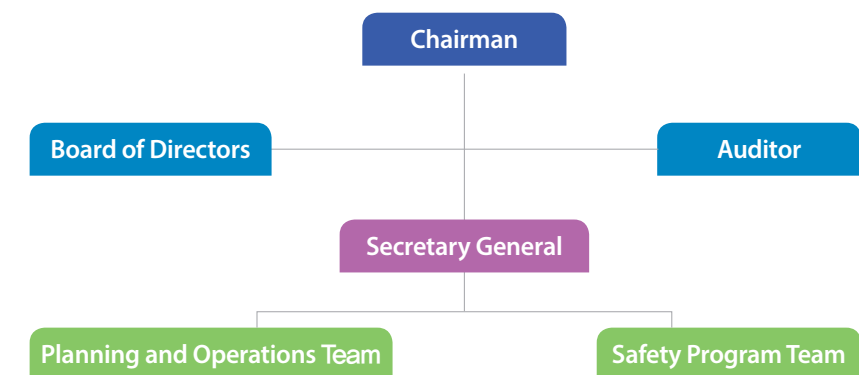
## 02 Objective of Establishment

- To contribute to the creation of a safe sporting environment by preventing the occurrence of accidents during sports activities, and running mutual aid and relief/aid programs in relation to sports-related accidents

## 03 Main Business Areas

- Educational and promotional activities to prevent the occurrence of accidents in sports
- Programs for preventing the occurrence of accidents at sports facilities
- Mutual aid and relief/aid programs associated with various accidents in sports
- Conducting of research and surveys on sports safety

# 01 Safety Education for Event Operators

## 1) On-site Sports Safety Education

: Safety education and training for the operators of major sporting events in 17 cities and provinces

## 2) Sports Management Capacity-building Education for Sports Organizations

: Safety management education and training for event operators of the sports organization members of the Korea Sport & Olympic Committee

## 3) Safety Education for Private Sports Facility Operators

: Safety education and training for swimming pool and ski resort operators and managers

### ► Main Educational Content

#### Sports Safety Awareness

- To define the "sports safety awareness" that all event operators must have, and help trainees recognize its importance and necessity

#### Safety Processes for Sporting Events

- To provide action guidelines to be observed before, during and after a sporting event, as well as check the current state of event operations in comparison with the best practice cases from overseas

#### Case Study of Sports-related Lawsuits

- To teach sports operators basic procedures for responding to law suits by helping them familiarize themselves with sports-related laws

#### CPR

- To define CPR, raise awareness of the importance of knowing how to perform CPR, and teach proper CPR method





## 02 Safety Education for Sports Instructors

### 1) Tailored Sports Safety Education Provided on Site

: Safety education for sports instructors provided according to the sport and people they teach

### 2) First Aid Training for Prospective and Current PE Teachers

: First aid training incl. CPR training for prospective and current PE teachers

#### ► Main Educational Content

##### Sports Safety Awareness

- To define the “sports safety awareness” that all sports instructors must have, and help the trainees recognize its importance and necessity

##### Sports Safety Guidance

- To check the current state of sports instruction programs in comparison with the best practice cases from overseas

##### Physical Injuries Caused by Impact

- To teach the relevant first aid methods for treating concussion, skull fracture, cervical spine/spinal cord injury, facial injury etc

##### CPR

- To define CPR, raise awareness of the importance of knowing how to perform CPR, and teach proper CPR method

## 03 Safety Education for Sports Participants

### 1) Support for the Operation of Cycling Schools

: Cycling safety education and training for young children and adolescents, as well as a safety certification system

### 2) Support for the Operation of Youth Sports Safety Camps

: Operation of regional sports safety camps (17 cities and provinces) to ensure safety in youth sports activities

#### ► Main Educational Content

##### Sports Safety Awareness

- To define the “sports safety awareness” that all sports participants must have, and help the trainees recognize its importance and necessity

##### Instilling Good Habits for Sports Safety

- To teach sports participants how to put on protective gear and do warm-up exercises so as to prevent the occurrence of injuries during sports activities

### 3) Sports Safety Campaigns

: Inform the public, via mass media and social networking sites, of detailed measures for prevention and handling of accidents and injuries during sports activities

## 05 Development & Use of Sports Safety Manuals

# Mutual Aid Program for Sports Safety

## 01 Program Description

- An insurance system for physical injuries that may occur during a sports activity

## 02 Background

- 1) Injuries occur frequently during sports activities, but it is difficult to subscribe to a sports insurance policy offered by private insurance companies due to limits on the number of people that can be insured.
- 2) Policy subscription criteria are very strict and the amount of coverage is insufficient when it comes to private insurance for sports injuries and accidents.

## 03 Characteristics of the Mutual Aid Program

- 1) Anyone can register without a subscription review regarding age, gender or disability;
- 2) Individuals can subscribe to more than 120 sporting categories without the need to be concerned about any limits on the number of people that can be insured;
- 3) The indemnification policy can be subscribed for "multiple and unspecified individuals" without the need to provide their personal information;
- 4) Subscribers will be compensated by this policy in addition to the personal injury insurance policy that they have subscribed to (dual insurance coverage).

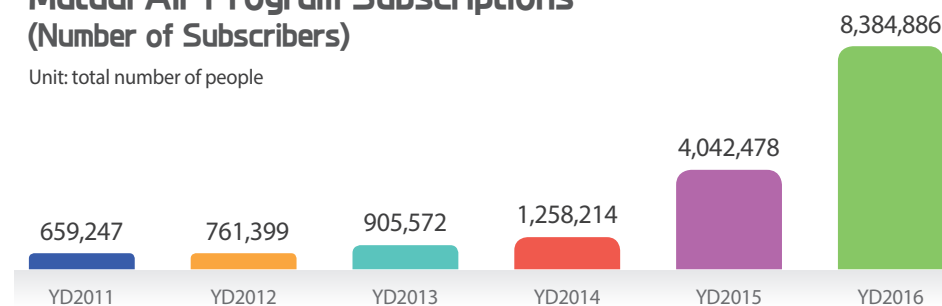


## 04 Types of Mutual Aid Policy

Eligibility	Product	Compensation
Operator	Liability Insurance for host	Compensations for accidents occurring during a sporting event/ competition hosted by the policyholder (Partial compensation for accidents of which the cause is attributable to the host organization)
	Liability Insurance for Sporting Facility Operators	Compensations for property damage and disasters/accidents occurring at a sporting facility (Partial compensation for accidents of which the cause is attributable to the facility operator, and coverage for properties damaged by fire etc.)
	Liability Insurance for Underwater and Onshore Accidents	Compensations for accidents occurring during underwater or onshore activities (Compensations for the liability of scuba diving instructors)
Participant	1-year Policy	Covers accidents occurring during an everyday sporting activity
	Injury Insurance for Professional Athletes	Covers accidents occurring during a professional sporting event
	One-time / Participants Safety (ALL)	Covers accidents occurring during a one-time event or competition
	Training/Workshops	Covers accidents occurring during training or a workshop

Unit: total number of people



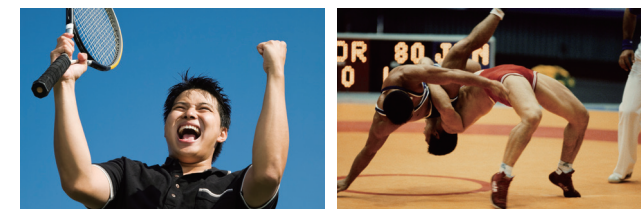

# Sports Safety Research and Development and Operation of New Programs

## 01 Current Situation Related to Accidents in Sports

- A fact-finding survey is conducted on a regular basis to determine the populations that are vulnerable to sports-related accidents, as well as sporting categories where accidents are frequent, so as to reflect the results in the safety education and mutual aid programs

#### RED

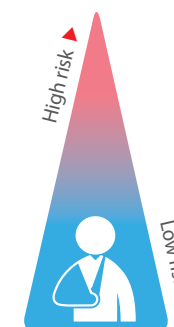
- Soccer (football), cycling, martial arts, basketball, and aerial sports

#### YELLOW

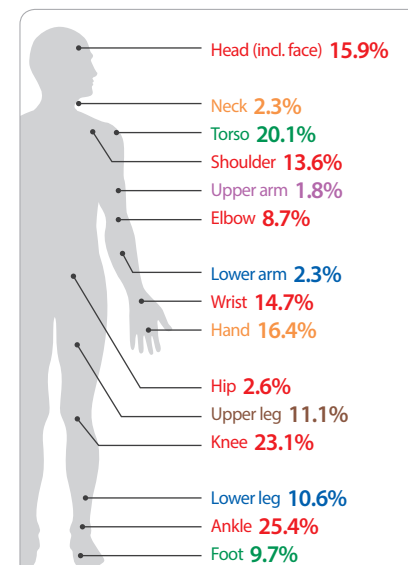
- Mountain climbing, skiing/snowboarding, bodybuilding (weight training), golf, baseball, tennis, gateball, and equestrianism

#### GREEN

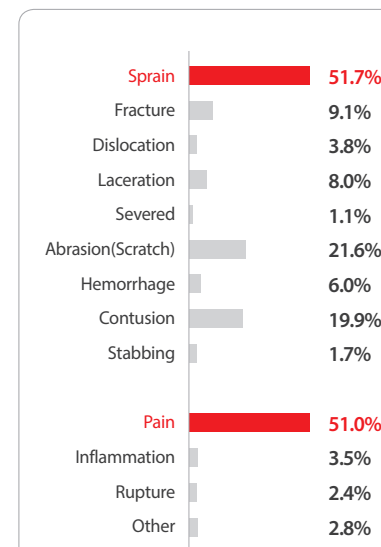
- Ice skating, inline skating, badminton, walking, running, swimming, bowling, aerobics, yoga, and table tennis
