Mutual Aid

1) Injuries occur frequently during sports activities, but it is difficult to subscribe to a sports insurance policy offered by private insurance companies due to limits on the number of people that can be insured.

2) Policy subscription criteria are very strict and the amount of coverage is insufficient when it comes to private insurance for sports injuries and accidents.

03 Characteristics of the Mutual Aid Program

1) Anyone can register without a subscription review regarding age, gender or disability;

- **2)** Individuals can subscribe to more than 120 sporting categories without the need to be concerned about any limits on the number of people that can be insured;
- **3)** The indemnification policy can be subscribed for "multiple and unspecified individuals" without the need to provide their personal information;
- **4)** Subscribers will be compensated by this policy in addition to the personal injury insurance policy that they have subscribed to (dual insurance coverage).

	Liability Insurance for host	Compensations for accidents occurring during a sporting event/ competition hosted by the policyholder (Partial compensation for accidents of which the cause is attributable to the host organization)		
Operator	Liability Insurance for Sporting Facility Operators	Compensations for property damage and disasters/accidents occurring at a sporting facility (Partial compensation for accidents of which the cause is attributable to the facility operator, and coverage for properties damaged by fire etc.)		
	Liability Insurance for Underwater and Onshore Accidents	Compensations for accidents occurring during underwater or onshore activities (Compensations for the liability of scuba diving instructors)		
	1-year Policy	Covers accidents occurring during an everyday sporting activity
